

COUNTY CASE MANAGEMENT ADVISORY BOARD

- Origin: *Iowa Administrative Code* Section 441, Chapter 24: Accreditation of Providers of Services
- Number of Members: A minimum of three (3) members, at least 51% of whom are not providers and a minimum of one member with a disability or has a family member with a disability.
- Appointed by: The Johnson County Board of Supervisors
- Term: Members serve three (3) year terms
- Purpose: The purpose of the Case Management Advisory Board is to advise the Board of Supervisors in all matters pertaining to the needs of, and services for, any person who is receiving Medicaid Case Management services from the Johnson County Case Management program. To this end, the Advisory Board will review and evaluate the appropriateness, effectiveness, and efficiency of the service being provided in order to ensure continuity of service provision and to make recommendations regarding need for development, expansion, and modification of such services.
- Duties: Include, but are not limited to, the following:
- (1) Review of and recommendations for program policies,
 - (2) Development and review of the organizational plan,
 - (3) Review of and recommendations for the future programming,
 - (4) Review of and recommendations regarding the evaluation of the program.
- Meetings: Required, at least three times per year
